Home Repairs

The following are resources for low or no cost home repairs.

Habitat for Humanity of the Charlotte Region

The Critical Home Repair (CHR) program provides urgent, major repairs at a subsidized rate, allowing homeowners to remain in their homes.

CHR program addresses health and safety concerns such as, but not limited to:

- Unsafe roofing or flooring
- Lack of heat
- Electrical hazards
- Plumbing hazards
- Accessibility updates including handrails, ramps, and bathroom modifications

CHR DOES NOT ADDRESS:

- · Cosmetic repairs or painting
- Replacing carpeting or flooring (unless for structural reasons)
- Window replacement (unless current windows are rotted or contain lead)
- Bathroom renovations or remodels (unless for accessibility issues or as needed following plumbing repairs)

The City of Charlotte

Provides several housing repair programs for low-income city residents. In addition, the City partners with nonprofit organizations offering home repair programs to the Charlotte community. Some of the home rehabilitation and repair programs offered by the City of Charlotte include:

- The Safe Home Emergency Repair Program provides grants to low-income homeowners to address needed home repairs. The program seeks to correct code and incipient violations (items in a house that will need to be repaired or replaced in two to three years) and make general property improvements. The program serves singlefamily owner-occupied dwellings in need of repairs that can lead to a health and safety threat.
- LeadSafe Charlotte provides grants to assist low-income homeowners with addressing
 unsafe lead paint conditions that pose a potential health hazard to young children. The
 program is designed to assist owners of single and multifamily dwellings and investor
 owners of properties with two or more bedrooms. Some of the services we offer for
 those who qualify: Free lead inspections at your home, free blood testing of children
 (finger stick), and free remediation of lead hazards at your home or rental property. Visit

Home Repairs: Seniors and Special Needs

North Carolina Housing Finance Agency (NCHFA)

If you are elderly or have special needs and your income is low, you may be eligible for urgent repairs, comprehensive rehabilitation or accessibility modifications on your home. NCHFA provides financing to local government and nonprofit partners that may help you. Emergency repairs can correct housing conditions that threaten your life or safety, and accessibility modifications can help you to remain in your home after an injury or serious illness.

Understanding Eviction

Disclaimer: This guide is not meant to provide legal advice. The following is an overview of the eviction process. Contact the agencies listed below as soon as you receive a notice from your landlord. Appointment slots fill up fast and funds are quickly depleted.

Know Your Rights:

- A verbal or written notice from your landlord to move out is not a legal eviction. The only legal way a landlord can evict is through a court order.
- When facing eviction, you will receive a summons and have the right to appear in small claims court to present your defense. You may also bring counterclaims to court, such as evidence of a landlord not making repairs to the property.
- North Carolina law generally doesn't allow tenants to withhold rent until repairs are made. But in some specific instances a judge or magistrate can order the rent to be held.
- Landlords cannot change the locks, or withhold or remove belongings before an eviction is granted. If you miss your court date: You have 10 days to appeal the eviction ruling and have the right to stay in the unit during the appeal as long as you continue to pay rent.
- North Carolina laws protect you from retaliatory eviction. Landlords cannot evict as retribution for calling code enforcement, asking for repairs, or organizing with other tenants.
- Hiring an attorney isn't required but often landlords are much more likely to appear in court with a lawyer than the tenant facing eviction.

Understanding Foreclosure

The following are resources for understanding foreclosure.

Understanding Foreclosure

Foreclosure is a legal process in which a lender attempts to recover the balance of a loan from a borrower who has stopped making payments to the lender by forcing the sale of the asset (usually the home) used as the collateral for the loan.

If You Receive a Foreclosure Notice in the Mail

If you receive a foreclosure notice in the mail, it means you've fallen far enough behind in your mortgage payments that your lender intends to take your property and sell it off unless you make up the late payments.

If You Find Yourself in Need of Foreclosure Prevention Assistance

Don't delay seeking help! The homeowner is given a limited period of time where they have a chance to cure the default and pay all amounts due, including interest, penalties, attorney charges and any other fees allowed by the law or the mortgage. Contact your mortgage lender as soon as you know you will be unable to make your mortgage payments. Let them know of your circumstances. *Contact your lender*. Find out the exact details of what the lender believes you did or did not do. Ask the lender what you can do to remedy the default. Some lenders will work with you, so it doesn't hurt to ask.

The North Carolina Foreclosure Mediation Program

A clerk of court may be able to delay the foreclosure process for up to 60 days as needed. The delay of the foreclosure hearing will provide the homeowner more time to work out a payment plan with the bank, mortgage servicer, or lender. Housing Financial Assistance

The following are resources for help with paying for rent and mortgages.

Property Providers: can sometimes be forgiving if you fall on temporary hard times. If you are a good tenant and have a good relationship with your landlord, they may be willing to work with you. Ask if they will accept a late payment or if you can pay your rent in installments. Could not hurt to speak to them as soon as you know you may be in trouble as they may not want the additional court costs for an eviction.

Crisis Assistance Ministry

Defining Transitional Housing

The following are definitions of the different kinds of transitional housing available.

Transitional Housing

Refers to a supportive - yet temporary - type of accommodation that is meant to bridge the gap from homelessness to permanent housing by offering structure, supervision, support (for addictions and mental health, for instance), life skills, and in some cases, education and training.

Day Shelter

Day Shelters take in the homeless during the day. Some day shelters also operate as night shelters where individuals can also sleep. The purpose of a day shelter is to give the homeless a place to shower, eat meals, make phone calls, and use the computer to look for work.

Family Shelter

As the name implies a family shelter attempts to house the whole family together. Most family shelters only house women and children, often separating the father from this family. However, some family shelters are equipped to keep the family unit together. Family shelters often have private cooking and bathing areas for each family unit. In a family shelter, there are counseling services, job search resources, and even child care.

Emergency Warming Center

A Warming Center is a no-frills facility. Often called a "hot and a cot", it provides overnight shelter and a hot meal. This type of shelter is open to any one that passes the basic requirement: wanting to get off the streets for the night. A basic pat down is all that is required. Because of this, guests can change from night to night, so theft and drug overdoses are not uncommon. Warming Centers operate during the coldest months of the year. Guests are required to leave in the morning and often roam the streets or go to day centers.

Emergency Shelter

Like the warming center, it is open to anyone wanting to get off the streets. Emergency shelters for families and individuals are open year-round and provide some limited resources. This type of shelter may see the same guest nightly so a more thorough screening is conducted and the guests are able to stay up to 30 days.

Rotating Shelter

Rotating shelters are ones that move from location to location, often within a network of churches. As the location rotates, so do the guests. These shelters are more structured and the guests are expected to stay for a defined length of time to benefit from all of the available resources needed to get permanent housing. There are rules to follow such as no smoking or drug use in the facility. Breathalyzers and searches of the guest and their belongings are often done at check-in. Case management and job search resources are available. Failure to follow the rules can result in being discharged from the program.

Utility Shut-Off Prevention Resources

The following are resources for people facing utility shut-off.

Contact the Utility Company

Call the company before the threats become dire. Most utility companies will let you get two or three months behind as long as you tell them when you'll be able to make up what you owe. If your service has been shut off, the company will most likely require you to make a security deposit-usually for about three times the average of your monthly bill-before it reconnects you. The deposit rates following disconnects are regulated in some states. You may want to call a Legal Aid or Legal Services office to learn about your state's law.

Utility Discount Programs

Many utility companies offer reduced rates and payment plans to elderly and low-income people.

Programs That Average Your Bills Throughout the Year

Also called "being on a budget". Sometimes we fall behind on our energy bills during periods when we use a lot of energy and incur high bills-winter in the north, summers in the south, for example. Many energy utilities offer programs that average your periods of high and low usage and allow you to pay one set monthly payment all year long.

Utility Conservation Assistance Programs

Often local utility companies offer utility conservation assist-need programs, often at no cost. These measures, like long lasting light bulbs, weather-stripping for doors and windows and filters for furnaces can often cut your bill by as much as one-third to one-half.

Filing for Bankruptcy

Filing for bankruptcy can provide a temporary stop to a utility shut-off, but you'll have to provide some proof that you can pay future bills if you want to keep the termination at bay permanently. Contact your bankruptcy attorney or your local legal aid office for more information.

Crisis Assistance Ministry

If you have received a disconnection notice on your utility service, they may be able to aid with paying all or a portion of your energy bill shut offs.

What Does The Health Department Do? The county health department improves the health status of the community by preventing epidemics, protecting against environmental hazards, encouraging healthy behaviors, preparing for and responding to disasters, and assuring the quality and accessibility of health services.

Health Insurance

Covers the cost of medical and surgical expenses incurred by the insured. The insured either has to pay such expenses out-of-pocket or is later reimbursed by the insurer or the insurance company settles the bill directly with the hospital.

Affordable Care Act's Coverage Mandate

Under the ACA, also commonly called Obamacare, Americans who were not otherwise eligible for an exemption were required to have health insurance coverage for themselves and their families. Failure to have minimum health insurance triggered a tax penalty; at the same time, the ACA allowed for the creation of a premium tax credit to help Americans offset some of the cost of getting health insurance through the Open Marketplace. This rule changed in January 2019, when the tax penalty mandate for health insurance was eliminated. While the ACA technically still exists, Americans who choose not to maintain health insurance for themselves or their family members in 2019 and beyond won't be penalized at tax time. It's estimated that as many as four million Americans have chosen not to have health insurance coverage this year as a result of the penalty being eliminated.

Medicaid

Medicaid Insurance

- Any age with a diagnosis of End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) or Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS)

If you have a problem with bed bugs

If you think you or your child may have lice

Head lice most often affect children who are in direct contact with one another or who share personal items, such as brushes, hats, or scarves. Symptoms include itching, visible lice on the scalp, and lice eggs (nits) on the hair shafts. Medicated shampoos often help, but lice are becoming resistant to some. Patiently combing and removing nits, sometimes over several days, is sometimes necessary. Consult a doctor for the best medical advice.

Immunization Services

Commonly known as shots, protect our community from deadly diseases. These diseases still exist and can spread quickly. It is better to prevent diseases than to treat them. Your local health department offers immunizations (shots) in a safe and caring environment. They are committed to assessing and offering all shots to protect you from disease. Some immunizations provided by the Health Department are free. For paid vaccines there is a fee schedule.
